HEAT STROKE

SYMPTOMS

- One or more of the following symptoms may be noticed:
 - ☐ Dizziness, nausea, headache, vomiting, fainting, or loss of consciousness.
 - ☐ Excessive sweating.
 - ☐ Rapid, shallow breathing.
 - ☐ Loss of control over arms and legs.
 - ☐ Collapse and unconsciousness.

TREATMENT

- ☐ Start treatment immediately and send for a medical officer or a doctor.
- ☐ Do not move the patient unless it is necessary to get him to a cooler place or to a doctor.
- ☐ Remove all his clothing, except his rubber boots and safety harness and then compress him with the hands or a blanket or a rug.
- ☐ Continue this cooling treatment until normal body temperature is reached. Do not stop until normal.
- ☐ If breathing fails, apply artificial respiration while cooling.
- ☐ Give water to drink if your patient is conscious.

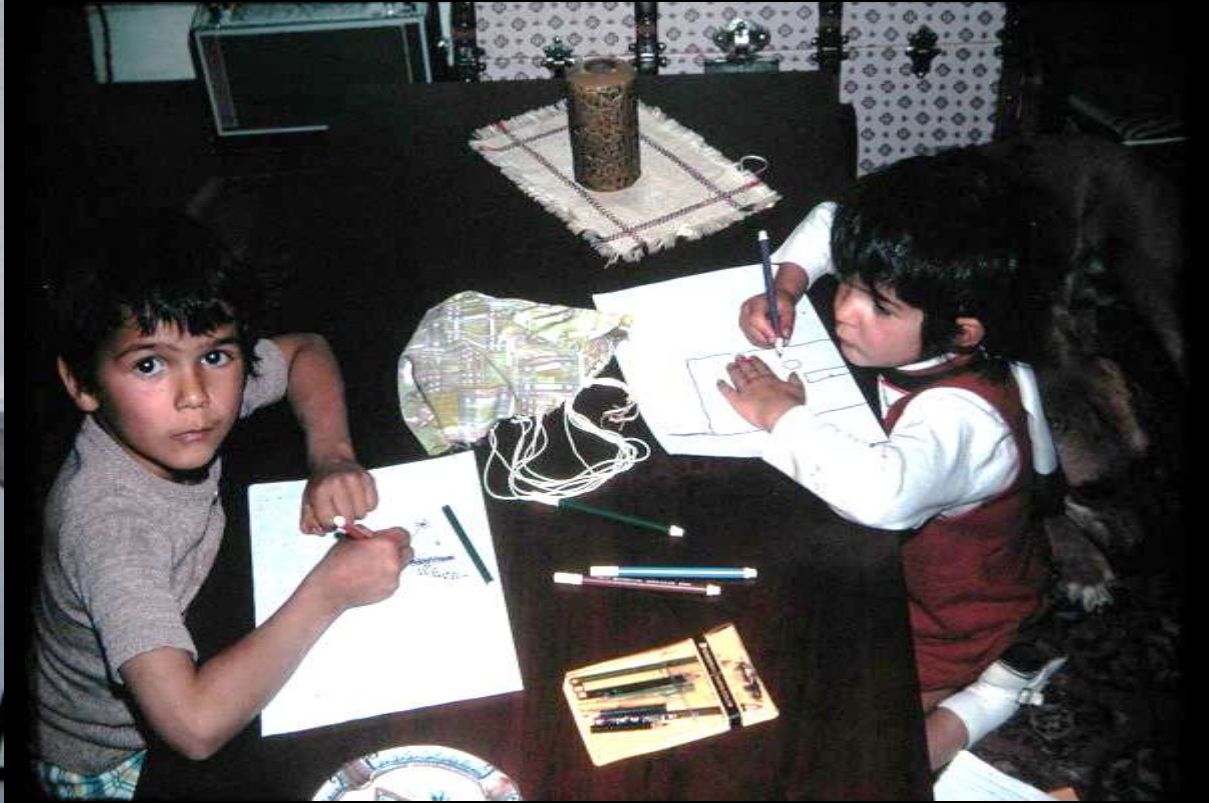
